Da'naxda'xw First Nation Post-Secondary Funding Policy

1. Contact Post-Secondary Coordinator, he/she will fax or email you our Post-Secondary Funding Application to fill out and you fax or email back to the office. Ask you to email or fax us your letter of intent. Your letter should include the program, program length and institution.
2. When we receive your letter of intent your name will go on the bottom of our student waitlist. We will contact you when your name gets to the top of the list and we are sure when the previous student will be finished.
3. Before you start your classes, you fill out and sign a sponsor form from the institution, this gives the school permission to give us your grades and send us the tuition invoice. We will **not** keep funding a student that is failing courses.
4. If you change your mind about what program or what institution you want to be in, inform our office immediately, your funding will be discontinued, your name will then go on the bottom of the waitlist.
5. Students that quit their program and continue to receive Living Allowance, without informing the office will go on our **NON**-Funded Student list.

When your name gets to the top of the list you will get full funding. Meaning you will get a living allowance and book allowance **if** your program is more than 1 year. We have to have your current address, phone number and email address at all times.

Short-term students 1 year or less, or Distance Education students **DO NOT** qualify for living allowance.

Students are entitled to:

One-year University College Entrance Preparation (UCEP) program if needed
and

One year for Certificate program
or

Two years for Diploma program
or

Four years for Degree program

And, if needed, one year of just tuition to finish a Degree program

Eligible expenditures for PSSSP and UCEPP are:

- The actual cost of tuition and other compulsory student fees
- Initial professional certification and examination fees
- Books and supplies required by the student for their program of study official transcript fees
- Application fees
- For full-time students only, as defined by the post-secondary institution, regional living allowances for the student, and if applicable, each dependent up to the maximum of those established by the Canada Student Loan Program as amended from time to time.

Living Allowance for a single student living at home – \$400.00

Living Allowance for a single student living on their own - \$1100.00

Living Allowance per child dependent - \$200.00

Book Allowance per semester - \$500.00

Supplies that are necessary for your courses

These funds are to assist students through their Post-Secondary endeavours, not meant to support students.

Part-time students, as defined by the post-secondary institution being attended, may receive assistance for tuition and compulsory fees, and the actual cost of books and supplies which are listed as required by the post-secondary institution. Part-time students that are taking 2 classes are eligible to receive a living allowance at a prorated amount equal to half the living allowance they would receive as a full-time student and if a student is taking one class, they will be eligible for a quarter of the living allowance of the full-time student.
